

“7 Card Thrill”

Rules of Play

7 Card Thrill is a casino game played using a standard deck of 52 cards plus one joker that can be used as a wild card. The object of the game is to have a hand of 5 Aces or a hand closer to 5 Aces than the dealer's hand. The player's best five card poker hand out of seven cards is compared to the dealer's five card poker hand according to traditional poker rankings.

To begin, players must make one of four primary wagers: Poker Bet, Pair of Kings or Better Bet, 3 of a Kind or Better Bet, Full House or Better Bet. They also may optionally make a Special Bet.

Each player will then receive seven cards face down and the dealer will receive seven cards, exposing the top card only. The joker can be used as an ace, or to complete a straight, a flush, a straight flush or a royal flush.

Players evaluate their hand and place two discards on the marked area of the layout. The dealer reveals his hand and discards two cards. All wagers are then resolved as follows:

Poker Bet-

If the player's hand ranks higher than the dealer's hand, the player is paid even money. But, when the dealer's losing hand is a King/Jack high card hand or lower, the player is paid one half of his wager.

If the player's hand ranks lower than the dealer's hand, the player loses his wager.

If the player's hand ties the dealer's hand, the hands push.

***Pair of Kings or Better Bet-**

If the player's best five card poker hand contains a pair of kings or better, the player is paid even money. But, if the hand contains a pair of kings, the player is paid half of their wager.

***3 of a Kind or Better Bet-**

If the player's best five card poker hand contains a 3 of a kind or better, the player is paid 4 to 1.

***Full House or Better Bet-**

If the player's best five card poker hand contains a full house or better, the player is paid 30 to 1.

***Special Bet-**

If the player's best five card poker hand contains a straight flush or better, the player is paid odds according to the payable.

Hand	Payout
Five Aces	20,000 to 1
Royal Flush	2,000 to 1
Straight Flush	300 to 1

*Pays regardless of the outcome of the Poker Bet.

Note: A hand of Ace, 2, 3, 4 and 5, is the second highest straight. Ace is the highest, King is the second highest and Two is the lowest.
