

ALL IN STUD

Rules of Play

Game Description

All in Stud is a house-banked, poker-based, card game played with one standard 52-card deck. The object of the game is for the player to achieve a poker hand that triggers a winning event against a payable. All in Stud also contains several optional bonus wagers, which are won if the player's hand achieves a predetermined winning event posted on the corresponding paytables. Casino operators choose which wagers they will offer and the minimum and maximum wagering limits.

Game Play

1. To begin the game, each player must make an Ante wager. Each player may also place optional Pocket 3, Lo Ball and/or Jackpot Bonus wagers.
2. Each player receives three cards, face down. The dealer receives two cards and places them, face down, in the designated community board area.
3. After examining their three hole cards, each player must:
 - a. Place a Raise 4th wager equal to their original Ante wager.

OR

 - b. Check.
4. The dealer reveals the first community card (designated as box 4th on the felt). After examining the first community card, each player must:
 - a. Place a Raise 5th wager equal to their original Ante wager.

OR

 - b. Check.
5. The dealer reveals the second and final community card (designated as box 5th on the felt). Each player combines their three hole cards with the two community cards to form a five-card poker hand.

6. The dealer examines each player's hand and pays winning hands according to the payable in Appendix A. At this time, the dealer also evaluates all optional Bonus wagers and pays according to the corresponding paytables in Appendices B through D.

Optional Bonus Wagers

All in Stud also contains several optional bonus wagers, which are made prior to the start of a round of play.

Pocket 3

The Pocket 3 wager wins if the player's three hole cards consist of a Pair or better. The wager is paid out according to the payable in Appendix B.

Lo Ball

The Lo Ball wager wins if the player's three hole cards combined with the two community cards consist of one of the winning triggering events posted in the accompanying payable in Appendix C.

Jackpot

The Jackpot wager wins if the player's three hole cards combined with the two community cards, consist of one of the winning triggering events posted in the accompanying paytables in Appendix D.

Appendix A – Ante/Raise Paytables

The player is wagering that their three hole cards combined with the two community cards will consist of a Pair of 10's or better as displayed in the paytables below:

The player is wagering that their three hole cards will consist of a Pair or better as displayed in the paytables below:

2. Pocket 3 wager is independent of the outcome of the primary game's result.
3. Casino operators may post a maximum aggregate amount payable per round or per hand.

Appendix C – Lo Ball Paytables

The player is wagering that their three hole cards combined with the two community cards will comprise of one of the winning triggering events displayed in the payable below:

Notes:

1. Only the highest qualifying hand is paid.
2. Ace is always high.
3. Straights and Flushes count in the evaluation of the Lo Ball wager. Specifically, if a player's final 5 card hand contains a Straight or a Flush they are NOT eligible for a Lo Ball payout. For example, a player possessing 2,4,5,6 and 7 of hearts, would Not qualify for the Lo Ball payout as this is a Flush.
4. Lo Ball wager is independent of the outcome of the primary game's result.
5. Casino operators may post a maximum aggregate amount payable per round or per hand.

Appendix D – Jackpot Paytables

The player is wagering that their three hole cards combined with the two community cards will comprise of one of the winning triggering events displayed in the paytables below:
