

## Rules of Play – Dragon Pai Gow

Dragon Pai Gow is a variation to the standard game of Pai Gow Poker. The game is played using a 52 card deck plus a Joker with up to 5 player positions at the table.

To begin, players must place the main Pai Gow Poker wager and may optionally place the Double Bonus, Dragon Hand and/or Dragon Hand Bonus wagers. The dealer then deals seven cards to each of the active player positions, seven cards to the dealer position and seven cards to a Dragon Hand (community hand) position.

Players then set their hands according to standard Pai Gow Poker rules. The dealer sets his hand and the Dragon Hand according to house rules. Note: Players may place the Dragon Hand wager any time before the dealer exposes his cards.

The Dragon Hand side wager is won, lost or pushed per standard Pai Gow Poker rules. Players wager on the outcome of a community Pai Gow Poker hand.

The Double Bonus wager is resolved based on the seven cards dealt to the player. If the player's seven card hand forms a straight or better, the Double Bonus side wager pays odds according to the posted payable (see sample).

### 'Double Bonus/Dragon Hand Bonus'

Hand	Pays (to 1)
Natural 7-Card Royal Flush	200,000
Wild 7-Card Royal Flush	10,000
5 Aces	400
Royal Flush	150
Straight Flush	50
4-of-a-Kind	25
Full House	5
Flush	4
3-of-a-Kind	3
Straight	2

The Dragon Hand Bonus wager is resolved based on the seven cards dealt to the Dragon Hand. If the Dragon Hand's seven cards form a straight or better, the Dragon Hand Bonus side wager pays odds according to the posted payable (see sample above). For both side wagers, the Joker acts as usual in Pai Gow Poker fashion, and may substitute to fill straight, flushes, or straight flushes, and otherwise acts as an ace.

Regardless of the outcome of the player hand, any player wagering \$5 or more on the Double Bonus wager additionally qualifies for the fixed value community payout if any other player hand, or the Dragon Hand, meet the qualifying hand conditions, according to the posted payable (see sample). The community pays may also be awarded to a player wagering at least

\$5 on the Dragon Hand Bonus wager if any player hand, including their own, qualifies for a listed pay.

**'Community Paytable'**

<b>Hand</b>	<b>Payout</b>
Natural 7-Card Royal Flush	\$5,000
Wild 7-Card Royal Flush	\$2,500
Natural 7-Card Straight Flush	\$1,000
Wild 7-Card Straight Flush	\$500
5 Aces	\$250
Royal Flush	\$50
Straight Flush	\$20
4-of-a-Kind	\$5

Note: A player may receive more than one community payout in a single game.
