

# Insurance Plus V2

## Rules of Play

Insurance Plus is a variation to the standard game of Blackjack. The game is played using two, four, six or eight decks of 52 cards. After players have received their two original cards, if the dealer has a ten-value card showing, the player has the option to bet up to one-half of their original wager on the 'Insurance Plus.'

Should no active player hands be remaining in the game, the dealer will expose his hole card but not draw another card regardless of his total.

If the dealer's hole card is an Ace, the 'Insurance Plus' wager is paid 3 to 1. If the dealer's hole card is a 7, 8, or 9, the 'Insurance Plus' wager is lost. If the dealer's hole card is any other card, then the 'Insurance Plus' wager pushes; **or**

If the dealer has a blackjack or a final score of 20 or 21, the player will be paid according to the following paytables:

<b>Dealer's Final Total</b>	<b>Paytable E</b>	<b>Paytable F</b>	<b>Paytable G</b>
Any 20	Push	Push	Push
Any 21	6 to 1	7 to 1	7 to 1
Blackjack	3 to 1	3 to 1	3 to 1
Suited Blackjack	5 to 1	4 to 1	5 to 1

After the "Insurance Plus" wagers have been resolved, the regular game of blackjack will continue.

Note: The casino has the option to offer the 'Insurance Plus' wager only when there are two or more players at the table.
