NEPAL SUPER BACCARAT

SUMMARY:

Nepal Super Baccarat is a modified version of Nepal Baccarat with the addition of multiple side bets allowing the guest to wager on the winning point total (PLAYER WINS ON, BANKER WINS ON and TIE WINS ON). Consistent with the base game of Nepal Baccarat, there is no commission on the winning “Banker” wagers in Nepal Super Baccarat and winning Banker wagers are paid 1 to 2 if the Banker wins on a point total of 6.

The game can use five (5), six (6), seven (7) or eight (8) decks. Each deck of cards consists of fifty-two (52) cards.

The rules and payouts are described below:

BASE GAME (NEPAL BACCARAT):

The base game uses the standard Nepal Baccarat variant. The payouts are:

- If the patron wagers on the Player and the Player wins; the patron is paid 1 to 1.
- If the patron wagers on the Banker and the Banker wins:
 - Banker wagers pay 1 to 1.
 - If the Banker Score is six (6) the patron is paid 1 to 2.
- If the patron wagers on the Tie and the result is a Tie; the patron is paid 8 to 1.
- If the patron wagers on the Player or Banker and the result is a Tie; the Player/Banker wager will push.

NEPAL SUPER BACCARAT RULES

Nepal Super Baccarat is a Baccarat game with the following wager options: Banker, Player, Tie, Banker Pair, Player Pair, Lucky 6, Player Wins On, Banker Wins On, and Tie Wins On. Nepal Super Baccarat uses five (5) to eight (8) standard 52 card decks. The rules and are given below:

- Game play begins with the player placing wagers on one (1) or more of the following wagers: Banker, Player, Tie, Banker Pair, Player Pair, Lucky 6, Player Wins On, Banker Wins On, and Tie Wins On. Each wager is evaluated and paid out independently.

- After all wagers are placed, two (2) cards are dealt to the Player hand and two (2) cards are dealt to the Banker hand.
 - The first and third cards are dealt to the Player hand.
 - The second and fourth cards are dealt to the Banker hand.
 - Aces have a point value of one (1) and cards two (2) to nine (9), inclusive, have a point value equal to their face value. The Ten, Jack, Queen, and King have a point value of zero (0).
- The value of a hand is equal to the sum of the point value of each card in the hand. When the total is ten (10) or higher the value of the hand is equal to the right digit of this total.
- If either the Banker or Player has a total of eight (8) or nine (9) this is a “Natural” and no further cards are dealt.
- If there are no “Natural” hands, the rules for drawing additional cards are in accordance with the below Baccarat Table of Play:

If there is no “Natural” hand:

- Player:
 - If the Player hand has a point total of zero (0), one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4), or five (5) a card will be drawn for the Player hand.
 - If the player has a point total of six (6) or seven (7) the Player hand will stand.
- Banker:
 - If the Banker hand has a point total of zero (0), one (1), or two (2) a card will be drawn for the Banker hand.
 - If the Banker hand has a point total of three (3) a card will be drawn for the Banker hand unless the Player hand’s third card is an eight (8).
 - If the Banker hand has a point total of four (4) a card will be drawn for the Banker hand if the Player hand’s third card is two (2), three (3), four (4), five (5), six (6), or seven (7).
 - If the Banker hand has a point total of five (5) a card will be drawn for the Banker hand if the Player hand’s third card is four (4), five (5), six (6), or seven (7).
 - If the Banker hand has a point total of six (6) a card will be drawn for the Banker hand if the Player hand’s third card is a six (6) or seven (7).
 - If the Banker hand has a point total of seven (7) the Banker hand will stand.
 - If the Player stands on a six (6) or seven (7), and the Banker has a point total of zero (0), one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4), or five (5) a card will be drawn for the Banker hand.
- The winning hand has the highest point value. If the hands have the same final point value, then it is considered a tie.

PAIRS SIDE BET

If the patron wagers on either the Player Pairs or Banker Pairs and the first two (2) cards dealt to the Banker or Player respectively are a pair; the patron is paid 11 to 1. All other outcomes lose.

LUCKY SIX SIDE BET

The Lucky Six is an independent side bet that wins if the banker wins with a point total of six (6) with either two (2) or three (3) cards. The payout schedule is as follows:

3-Card Banker win of 6 pays 20 to 1 (or 21 for 1)

2-Card Banker win of 6 pays 12 to 1 (or 13 for 1)

All other outcomes lose.

WINNING POINT TOTAL SIDE BET

Nepal Super Baccarat offers additional independent side bets, patrons can wager on the winning point total. All other outcomes lose.

Player Wins On, Banker Wins On, Tie Wins On as paid as below:
