Panda Pai Gow Poker

RULES OF PLAY

Panda Pai Gow Poker is a modification of Pai Gow Poker offering two distinct optional wagers. The Panda Pai Gow Bonus wager considers the best hand possible among the player's seven cards and is reconciled against the posted paytable. The Panda Pai Gow Insurance wager wins if the seven card hand dealt to the player qualifies as one of the winning combinations.

Players may wager any amount within table limits; however, a Panda Pai Gow Bonus wager of at least \$5 qualifies them for Envy Bonus payouts. Players win the Envy Bonus when a player at the table receives a four of a kind or higher, excluding the dealer and his/her own hand.

How to play:

- To begin each round, players must make their standard Pai Gow Poker wagers and can make the optional Panda Pai Gow Bonus wager and the Panda Pai Gow Insurance wager. A player may play one or both. If a player wagers at least \$5 on the Panda Pai Gow Bonus, the dealer must place an "Envy" lammer either on top of the Panda Pai Gow Bonus wager or next to it.
- The dealer then follows house procedures for Pai Gow Poker.
- While reconciling the standard Pai Gow Poker wagers, the dealer also reconciles Panda Pai Gow Bonus wager and Panda Pai Gow Insurance wager if applicable.
 - If the player's hand qualifies for payouts, the dealer pays the player according to the posted paytable.

The dealer leaves the "Envy" lammer, if applicable, next to the player's original wager and payouts. The dealer will not pick up the envy lammer(s) until all wagers have been reconciled.

• If the player's hand does not qualify for payouts, the dealer takes the players Panda Pai Gow Bonus wager.

The dealer leaves the "Envy" lammer, if applicable, next to the player's original wager and payouts. The dealer will not pick up the envy lammer(s) until all wagers have been reconciled.

The Panda Pai Gow Insurance wager considers the lowest hand possible among the player's seven cards and is reconciled against the posted paytable.

The Panda Pai Gow Insurance wager wins if the seven card hand dealt to the player qualifies as one of the winning combinations in the posted paytable. The winning hand is independent of how the players play the seven card Pai Gow Poker hand for the base game.

• The dealer pays all Envy Bonuses at the end of the round. If at least one player has a four of a kind or higher, all players with envy lammers win according to the posted paytable. In the event more than one player has at least four of a kind, then all players with envy lammers win multiple payouts.

Note: A player cannot win the Envy Bonus for his/her own-or the dealer's-hand.
