

Paris Poker

RULES OF PLAY:

OVERVIEW

Paris Poker is played using a standard 52 card playing deck. Players must make an Ante bet to receive cards. Each player and dealer will receive five cards and use one of those five cards as a wild card. Paris Poker also offers the optional Player's Monster and Banker's Buster bonus wagers.

RECOMMENDED DEALING PROCEDURES

1. Set the i-Deal or i-Deal Plus to Paris Poker or a shuffler setting that delivers a 5-card hand.
2. Players make an ante wager to compete against the dealer, they may also make the Banker's Buster and Player's Monster bonus wagers.
3. To start the game, the dealer presses the green button on the shuffler to dispense the first packet of five cards.
4. Starting from their left and continuing clockwise around the table the dealer will give each participating player and themselves 5 cards face down.
 - a. If all the player spots are occupied with players, once the dealer's hand is dealt the shuffler will dispense the remaining cards and begin shuffling the other deck.
 - b. If all the player spots are not occupied with players, once the dealer's hand is dealt the dealer will need to press the green button on the shuffler to dispense the remaining cards and to begin shuffling the other deck.
5. Players look at their cards and have a choice:
 - a. Fold and lose their ante. The Monster Player wager (if played) remains in action and will be resolved at the end of the hand.
Note: The Banker's Buster bonus wager (if played) remains in action until the dealer's five card hand is exposed.
 - b. Stay in the game by making a Play bet of 1x their ante. The player will determine which card will be used as their wild card and place it face down in the area designated "Wild Card". The remaining four cards are tucked under the play wager.

6. The dealer then reveals their five-card hand and determines the Wild Card. **The dealer must have a pair of aces to qualify.** Starting from their right and working clockwise around the table the dealer will expose the player's four-card hand and place it face up on top of the Wild Card. The Wild Card is not revealed.
Note: If a player has 4 hearts and a club, they can make the club a Wild Card and their hand will be a flush. If the player has 3 of a kind, they may choose the lower of cards remaining to become a Wild Card and make 4 of a kind.
7. If the dealer does not qualify, all ante bets will push and be returned to the player. All Banker's Buster bets will win (if played). See Banker's Buster payable for odds. The player's hand must still beat the dealer's to win their play wager.
8. If the dealer's hand qualifies and beats the player's hand, the ante, play and (if played) Banker's Buster bet loses.
9. If the player's hand beats the dealer's hand, the ante and play bets pay 1 to 1. The Banker's Buster bet (if played) loses.
10. The Player's Monster wager is based on the value of the player's five-card hand only and is eligible to win even if your hand is beaten by the dealer's. See payable for odds
