

# POKER GONE WILD

## Rules of Play

Each player will be dealt 2 cards. The player will use these 2 cards along with the 3 community cards to make the best 5 card poker hand. The middle community card is a printed joker card on the layout. This joker card is wild and considered a playing card for the game. It can be used as any card to improve the rank of the player's hand. Qualifying hands are 3 of a kind or better. Players will only be paid for their highest ranked 5 card hand.

The game is optional for shuffling machine or hand shuffling and requires one standard deck of 52 cards. No jokers are in the deck.

To begin each round, players make the required ante bet to receive two card face down. Players may also place the First Four Cards side bet.

Players then decide to make an Optional Raise bet equal to the ante bet or check. The dealer will then reveal a community card and place it in the area marked 'third.'

Players then decide to make a River bet equal to the ante bet or fold. The dealer will then reveal a community card and place it in the area marked 'river.'

If the player folds their hand, the Ante and Optional Raise bets (if applicable) lose.

The player's two hole cards are then exposed and combined with the three community cards to make the best possible 5 card poker hand. The player's 5 card poker hand pays odds according to the associated payable. (See sample below)

## FIRST FOUR CARDS

The First Four Cards is an optional side bet based on the player's two hole cards, the third community card and the joker. These cards are combined to make the best 4 card poker hand. If the player folds their hand, the First Four Cards side bet is still in action. Qualifying hands are 3 of a kind or better. The First Four Cards side bet pays odds according to the payable below. (See example)

Hand	Paytable
Four of a Kind	18 to 1
Straight Flush	12 to 1
Flush	3 to 1
Straight	2 to 1
Three of a Kind	1 to 1

Note: Only highest hand paid.
