

Two Cards High

Rules of Play

“Two Cards High” is a house banked table game. The objective of “Two Cards High” is for the player to hold a two card hand with a higher sum total than the dealer. The player and the dealer are dealt five cards from which they form the two card hand. Both the player and the dealer must qualify with the sum of the three card hand equaling a multiple of 10.

The rules for “Two Cards High” are as follows:

1. One deck of cards with all face cards removed will be used.
2. Players begin by placing a wager.
3. Each player and the dealer are dealt five cards face down from which they form a two card hand.
4. The player and dealer must qualify.
 - a. The sum of their three card hand must be a multiple of 10.
 - b. Aces count as one, and two's through 10's count as their face value.
 - c. A hand consisting of 5-3-2-7-8 can be set with either 5-3-2 or 5-7-8 (either way, the sum of the three card hand is a multiple of 10).
 - d. The remaining two cards make up the two card hand that is played against the dealer.
5. The highest ranking of the two card hand is a pair of 10's. Aces are the lowest pair. A non-pair two card hand is evaluated by the sum of the two cards utilizing “modulo 10” as in Baccarat; therefore the total for the two card hand ranges from 0 to 9.
6. The hand with the higher pair or higher point total wins.
 - a. If the player's two card hand is a pair and wins, the player is paid 3 to 2.
 - b. If the player has a higher two card hand than the dealer, he is paid even money.
 - c. In the event of a tie, the player wins even money.
 - d. If the dealer does not qualify, and the player does qualify, the player is paid even money.

The five card poker side wager plays against a payable based on the outcome of the five cards that are dealt to the player. The payable is as follows:

Hand	Payout
Straight Flush	100 to 1
4 of a Kind	50 to 1
Full House	20 to 1
Flush	12 to 1
Straight	5 to 1
3 of a Kind	3 to 1
Two Pair	2 to 1
Pair of 7's or better	1 to 1
