



## How to Play

Yin Yang is played with a standard 52 card deck plus 1 joker. Total cards equals 53.  
Yin Yang Pai Gow is made up of 3 games, the standard game of Pai Gow and 2 side games.

The 2 side games are based on wagering on Red or Black.

All players make a mandatory wager on the standard game of Pai Gow.  
All players have the option to wager on either or both of the 2 side games- the Yin Bet and the Yang Bet.  
After all wagers are placed, the dealer deals 7 cards to all 6 player positions and 7 cards to the dealer's position.  
Total cards dealt equals 49.

There are 4 remaining cards. The dealer will bury the first card leaving 3 cards. These 3 cards are laid out face down in front of the dealer.  
These cards are used for the first side bet called the Yin Bet.

After all players have arranged their cards into the two standard Pai Gow hands, the first side game - the Yin Bet - will be played.  
The dealer will turn over the 3 cards in front of him.  
Dealer will settle all Yin bets starting from the dealer's right.

Yin winning hands: If there are 2 or more cards without a joker that match the color that the player wagered on, the player wins even money.  
Yin losing hands: If the joker appears as one of the 3 cards, the player loses. If the player doesn't match at least 2 cards of his color wager, the player loses.

After all winning players are paid and losing bets collected, the dealer will discard the 3 cards.

The dealer will now turn over his 7 cards and arrange them into 2 hands by house rules.

The second side game - the Yang Bet - will be played and settled before each player's Pai Gow bet is played and settled.  
Dealer will turn over the cards of the first player to the dealer's right.  
Dealer will settle that player's Yang bet before settling his Pai Gow bet.

Yang winning hands: If a player has 5 or more cards of the color he wagered on, the player wins. Player is paid odds from a pay table. (see page 5)  
The joker is wild and represents either red or black.

Yang losing hands: If a player doesn't have 5 or more cards of the color he wagered on, the player loses.

After settling the Yang Bet, the dealer will settle the player's Pai Gow bet by house rules.

Dealer will continue to the next player in the same method until all the Yang bets and Pai Gow bets are settled.
