Rules of Play Double 4 More

Overview:

Double 4 More is a variation of the traditional game of Blackjack with two rule changes. The player may double down for up to 3x the original wager and can do so on two or more cards. The second rule change is that any dealer bust that totals 22 will pay 1 to 2 (half) of the amounts wagered.

Rules:

Double 4 More Blackjack is dealt out of a 6 or 8 deck shoe. Play starts with each player placing a mandatory Blackjack wager. Following the house Blackjack procedure, the dealer will deal the player two cards, and themselves one card face-up and one card face-down. If the dealer shows an Ace card face-up they will offer insurance to the player or offer even money in the event the player has a Blackjack. The dealer will then peek for Blackjack. If the dealer has Blackjack, the game is immediately resolved with no further actions allowed. If the dealer does not have Blackjack and the player does have Blackjack, they will be paid 3:2 (or 6:5 depending on configuration). Note that an Ace and a 10-valued card received after splitting do not count as a Blackjack. Otherwise, the players must play out their hands by choosing from the following actions:

- · Stand: No further actions.
- Hit: Receive an additional card.
- Double Down (for More): Make a second wager up to three times the original wager and receive
 exactly one card, with no further actions allowed. This option is permitted under specific
 conditions, including after splitting (except on Aces), and on two or more cards.
- Split: If holding two identical-value cards, the player can split into two hands, placing an
 additional equal wager. Each hand is played separately. The player may split up to 3 times.

If a player's hand exceeds 21, it busts, and the wager is lost. Once players finish, the dealer reveals their face-down card and draws until reaching at least 17. The dealer must hit on a soft 17.

If the dealer busts the player will win even money unless the dealer busts with a total of 22, in which case the player will be paid 1:2 (half) their total bet.

If both the player and dealer do not bust, the hand will be resolved based on the hand totals. The player will be paid even money if they have the higher total, ties will push, and the player will lose if their hand's total is less than the dealers.

Rule Variations:

- 6 or 8 decks may be used (standard 52-card decks)
- Dealer always hits on soft 17.
- Players can split up to three times (Aces can only be split once and will receive only one card).
- · Surrender is not available.
- If the dealer shows an Ace, the player may take Even Money (paying 1:1) on Blackjack (only when Blackjacks are configured to pay 3:2).
- Players may place an Insurance bet (paying 2:1) if the dealer's up-card is an Ace.
