SUBJECT: AMENDMENTS TO NEVADA GAMING COMMISSION REGULATION
5.260

At its meeting on January 29, 2026, the Nevada Gaming Commission approved amendments to Regulation 5.260 (Cybersecurity), effective that same date. These amendments modify reporting requirements and terminology related to cybersecurity events affecting Nevada licensees, as listed below:

I. Updated Terminology and Definitions

The amendments replace the term 'cyber-attack' with 'cybersecurity incident', focusing regulatory obligations on confirmed unauthorized access events. Definitions for 'Board' and 'Chair' have been added to clarify communication pathways.

II. Cybersecurity Incident Response Plan Requirement

A new requirement mandates that each covered entity develop and maintain a documented cybersecurity incident response plan outlining procedures for preparing for, detecting, responding to, and recovering from cybersecurity incidents.

III. Revised Reporting Requirements and Timelines

Licensees must notify the Chair within 24 hours of activating their cybersecurity incident response plan. Reporting must include incidents originating from a third-party vendor if a patron's personally identifiable information has been compromised.

An Initial Cybersecurity Incident Response Report must then be submitted to the Board within five (5) calendar days of the incident response plan's activation. *In lieu of this written report*, a covered entity may request a meeting with the Chair to be held within the five (5) calendar day

period. Written updates must be provided every 30 days until the cybersecurity incident is fully resolved and documented.

IV. Chair's Authority to Modify Reporting Requirements

The amendments authorize the Chair to waive, modify, condition, or revoke reporting obligations at the Chair's discretion upon timely written request.
