SUBJECT: **Proposed Revisions to Technical Standards for Gaming Devices and Associated Equipment**

In accordance with Nevada Gaming Commission (NGC or Commission) Regulation 14.050, the Nevada Gaming Control Board (Board) has published proposed revisions to the following Technical Standards for Gaming Devices and Associated Equipment:

- Standard 3 – Integrity of and Proper Accounting for On-Line Slot Systems
- Standard 5 – Cashless Wagering Kiosks
- Standard 6 – Interactive Gaming Systems and Associated Equipment
- Standard 7 – Definitions; System Integrity of Associated Equipment; and General Reporting Requirements
- Standard 8 – Integrity of and Proper Accounting for Computerized Race & Sports Systems
- Standard 9 – Integrity of and Proper Accounting for Computerized Pari-Mutuel Systems
- Standard 10 – Integrity of and Proper Accounting for Computerized Keno Systems
- Standard 11 – Integrity of and Proper Accounting for Bingo Systems
- Standard 12 – Integrity of and Proper Accounting for Cashless Wagering Systems and Wagering Account Systems
- Standard 13 – Integrity of and Proper Accounting for Cage, Credit, Card Games, and Table Games Systems

This notice is being distributed in accordance with the notice requirements of NGC Regulation 14.050(2)(b). A copy of NGC Regulation 14.050 is attached to this notice.

Interested persons are invited to submit written statements, arguments, contentions, or comments concerning the proposed revisions. Pursuant to NGC Regulation 14.050(3), the Chair will consider all such written submissions received within 30 days after service of this notice. Written submissions or comments must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, October 5, 2026, and should be submitted by email to:

Please include “Technical Standards for Gaming Devices and Associated Equipment” in the subject line.

The proposed revisions and any timely submitted comments will be discussed at the Board’s October 7, 2026, meeting. Interested persons will also have an opportunity to provide feedback concerning the proposed revisions at the meeting. The meeting time, location, and agenda will be separately noticed and posted on the Board’s website at gaming.nv.gov.

Pursuant to NGC Regulation 14.050(4), any nonrestricted licensee or licensed manufacturer may object to the proposed revisions by filing a written objection with the Commission not later than 45 days after service of this notice. The deadline for filing a written objection with the Commission is October 19, 2026. The Commission will consider any timely filed objections in accordance with NGC Regulation 14.050(5).

The Chair will consider all timely submitted written statements, arguments, contentions, or comments before taking final action on the proposed revisions. The currently anticipated effective date of the revised Technical Standards for Gaming Devices and Associated Equipment is October 23, 2026. The Chair will provide separate written notice of the effective date in accordance with NGC Regulation 14.050(6).

REGULATION 14

MANUFACTURERS, DISTRIBUTORS, OPERATORS OF INTER-CASINO LINKED SYSTEMS, GAMING DEVICES, NEW GAMES, INTER-CASINO LINKED SYSTEMS, ON-LINE SLOT METERING SYSTEMS, CASHLESS WAGERING SYSTEMS, MOBILE GAMING SYSTEMS, INTERACTIVE GAMING SYSTEMS AND ASSOCIATED EQUIPMENT; INDEPENDENT TESTING LABORATORIES

14.050 Technical standards.

1. The Chair shall publish technical standards for approval of gaming devices, cashless wagering systems, and associated equipment.

2. The Chair shall:

(a) Publish notice of proposed technical standards or revisions by posting the proposed changes or revisions on the Board's website;

(b) Mail notice of the posting of the proposed technical standards or revisions on the Board's website and a copy of this section to every nonrestricted licensee, licensed manufacturer and every person who has filed a request with the Commission; and

(c) Provide a copy of the proposed technical standards or revisions to the Commission.

3. The Chair shall consider all written statements, arguments, or contentions submitted by interested parties within 30 days of service of the notice provided for in subsection 2.

4. Not later than 45 days after service of written notice that the Chair has proposed the technical standards or revisions, any nonrestricted licensee or licensed manufacturer may object to the technical standards or revisions by filing a written objection with the Commission.

5. The Commission shall consider any objections filed to the technical standards or revisions proposed by the Chair. If the Commission does not concur with any of the technical standards, the Chair shall revise the technical standards to reflect the order of the Commission.

6. The Chair shall send written notice of the effective date of the standards or revisions to all nonrestricted licensees, licensed manufacturers and every person who has filed a request with the Commission.

7. Nonrestricted licensees or licensed manufacturers may propose the adoption, revision, or deletion of technical standards by submitting a written request to the Chair who will consider the request at the Chair's discretion. If the Chair does not propose the technical standard, the nonrestricted licensee or licensed manufacturers may file a request with the Commission to adopt, revise, or delete a technical standard. The Commission may consider the request at its discretion.

8. The Chair may waive for good cause shown the requirements of a technical standard for a gaming device or associated equipment. The Chair has full and absolute authority to condition or limit a waiver granted under this subsection for any cause deemed reasonable.
