SUBJECT: BAR REOPENING IN CLARK, ELKO, WASHOE, and NYE COUNTIES

The COVID-19 Mitigation and Management Task Force voted to allow bars, taverns, breweries, and distilleries to reopen in Clark County and Elko County no sooner than 11:59pm on Sunday, September 20, 2020, in Washoe County no sooner than 11:59pm on Wednesday, September 16, 2020, and in Nye County no sooner than 11:59pm on Thursday, September 10, 2020, under the provisions of sections 25 and 26 of Emergency Directive 021. This includes the allowance of bartop gaming machines.

Upon reopening, all restricted licensees must continue to comply with all of the provisions of the <u>Board's Health and Safety Policies for Restricted Licensees</u>. Bars within nonrestricted locations are able to reopen and expected to comply with the plans that each licensee submitted to the Board pursuant to the <u>Board's Health and Safety Policies for Nonrestricted Licensees</u>. Nonrestricted locations are not required to resubmit a plan if there are no changes to the plan currently on file with the Board.

All gaming establishments must continue to:

- Ensure proper social distancing between gaming machines at least 6 feet apart or complying with an alternate plan approved by the Board;
- Ensure that all employees, patrons, and guests properly utilize face coverings; and
- Comply with social distancing guidelines and not allow patrons to congregate.

Licensees are encouraged to review the <u>Governor's Bar Guidance</u> (revised September 17, 2020) and the <u>Nevada Health Response website</u> for all Statewide Standards and Operating Rules.
