3 Hand Hold'Em

Rules of Play

"3 Hand Hold 'Em" is a house banked poker game played using one standard 52 card deck. The objective of "3 Hand Hold 'Em" is to arrange six cards into three, two card hands. Each of the three hands are combined with five community cards to make three, five card poker hands which are compared to the dealer's single five card poker hand. It is not necessary both player cards be used to make the highest possible five card poker hand.

To begin, the player makes three equal wagers, and may make an optional 6 Card Bonus wager.

- 1. The player receives six cards from the dealer and arranges the cards into three two card hands.
- The dealer picks the best two cards from the dealer's six card hand and discards the remaining four cards. The dealer turns over five community cards and compares the dealer's hand to each one of the player's hands.
- 3. If the player's first hand beats the dealer's hand, the payout is one to one. If the player's second hand beats the dealer's hand, the payout is three to one. If the player's third hand beats the dealer's hand the payout is six to one.
- 4. If the player's first hand loses to the dealer's hand, all wagers (except the bonus wager) lose. If the player's second hand loses to the dealer's hand, the second and third wagers lose. If the player's third hand loses to the dealer's hand, the third wager loses.
- 5. In the event of a tie hand, the particular wager associated with that hand is collected by the dealer, but subsequent hand(s) remain in play.

The 6 Card Bonus wager is based on the player's original six cards, and is completely independent of the dealer's hand. If the player's six cards consist of two pair or better the side wager wins. Otherwise, the 6 Card Bonus wager is lost. See paytable below:
