

Blackjack Burnout is a variation of Blackjack, played using six standard 52 card decks. Blackjack Burnout features an option that allows the player the ability to burn/discard one "hit" card.

To begin, players make the standard Blackjack wager and may optionally make a 'Burnout' payment, equal to 20% of the amount of the primary wager (\$1 for each \$5 wagered) and/or the Bonus side wager(s).

The game proceeds according to house procedures and the following Blackjack rules:

- Blackjack pays 3 to 2
- The player may split Aces, receiving one additional card to each split hand.
- The player may not re-split, hit or double on split Aces.
- The player may split and re-split any other pair up to three times, for a maximum of four split hands.
- The player may double after splits, except split Aces.
- The dealer hits on soft 17.
- · Surrender is not allowed.

If a player has made a 'Burnout' payment, and has not split their hand, then they have the option of burning/discarding the hit card just received after any hit or double. When a card is burned, it is replaced with the next card from the deck. The 'Burnout' option may only be exercised once per game. The 'Burnout' payment is not returned to the player if the option to burn/discard is not used during the hand.

Bonus Wager

The Blackjack Burnout Bonus side wager(s) pay odds based on the player's winning streak. Players may wager on one or more of the Bonus wagers and the wagers do not have to be made in sequence. Players will be paid for each consecutive win with the corresponding wager made.

Pushes are not counted as a win or loss. If the player splits pairs, he/she must win the majority of their split hands to advance. An equal number of split hands results in a push.

Even money may be offered to the player if the player receives a blackjack and the dealer is showing an ace. If the player chooses even money and the dealer doesn't have a blackjack, then the Bonus wager advances. If the player and the dealer both have a blackjack, the hand results in a push and the Bonus wager stays in play for the next hand.

If the player loses a hand, all remaining Bonus wagers are lost.

A Bonus button for each player will be used to keep track of the consecutive wins.

Winning Bonus wagers shall be paid according to the following pay table.

Wager/Outcome	Payout
2 consecutive wins	2 to 1
3 consecutive wins	4 to 1
4 consecutive wins	8 to 1
5 consecutive wins	15 to 1
