Cash Out Craps

Game Description:

Cash Out Craps is an optional bonus wager played on a traditional Craps game. For this wager a player will try to roll as many unique numbers that can be made with two dice (2,3,4,5,6,8,9,10,11,12) as possible before rolling a 7. After a predetermined number of unique numbers have been rolled a player will be offered odds to cash out their wager or keep trying for bigger payouts.

The Cash Out wager is not dependent on the base game outcome. Operators may require a Pass/Don't Pass wager to bet the Cash Out wager.

Rules of Play:

- 1. Players may make an optional Cash Out wager.
- 2. Cash Out wagers can be made:
 - a. Anytime there are no active Cash Out wagers (for any players).
 - b. Operators may choose to restrict wagering to either before or after a come-out roll.
- 3. When a unique non-seven number is rolled, a lammer is placed on the layout to record the event. A number that repeats does not affect the outcome.
- 4. After a pre-determined number of unique non-seven numbers have been recorded, a player will be given the choice to cash out their wager for odds according to the paytable on the layout.
 - a. If the player cashes out, the dealer will pay them odds and return the payout as well as the original bet to the player. They will no longer be eligible for the Cash Out wager until the next wagering opportunity.
 - b. If the player does not ask to be cashed out, they will continue trying to make unique numbers on subsequent rolls.
 - c. An operator may allow a player to cash out for less. In this situation only the amount of the wager being cashed out will be paid odds and returned to the player. The remaining portion of their wager will remain in play.
 - d. An operator may allow a player to make multiple bets up front, allowing each bet to individually be cashed out.
- 5. If the player rolls a seven all Cash Out wagers will lose.
- 6. If the player rolls all ten unique non-seven numbers all Cash Out wagers will automatically pay out for the maximum payout.
- 7. A player may ask for their bet back any time after the first roll and before reaching the threshold to cash out.
- 8. An optional configuration is to turn the bet "off" during the come-out roll. This means that during any come-out roll no unique number will be counted, but also a seven rolled will not lose the Cash Out wager.

Paytables:

The following paytables may be used. A player must cash out to claim odds posted:
