DOUBLE UP BLACKJACK

Double Up Blackjack is a table game played with six or eight decks of 52 cards. To begin, players make the primary Double Up Blackjack wager. They may also place the optional 16 Bonus side wager.

The player and the dealer then receive two cards, per standard Blackjack procedures. The dealt hands are checked for blackjack (if applicable) and the following game rules apply:

- 1. Natural Blackjacks are paid 3:2 or 6:5 when the dealer does not have a blackjack.
- 2. Natural Blackjacks push when the dealer also has a blackjack.
- 3. Player's with a blackjack may elect to take even money when the dealer shows an Ace.
- 4. Any player can make an optional Double Up wager, equal to the amount of their original wager, on any 2-card hand, including split hands, except for a natural blackjack.
 - a. * At their discretion, the licensee may allow the player to place a Double Up wager at a lesser amount than the original wager.
- 5. If the player makes a Double Up Wager they must stand on that hand (i.e. they may not take any additional cards).
- 6. If the player has a higher final total than the dealer, they will be paid even money on their main wager and their Double Up wager, if placed.
- 7. If the dealer has a higher total than the player, the player will lose both their main wager and their Double Up wager, if placed.
- 8. If the dealer and player tie, the player's main wager is a push, but they will lose their Double Up wager, if placed.
- 9. All other winning wagers Main Wager, Double Up, or Double Down pay even money.
- 10. If the dealer is dealt or draws to a soft or hard total of 16, the game ends. If the player has a total of 21, the dealer pay all active wagers including Double Up and Double Down wagers, if placed, even money. If the player has a total other than 21, all active wagers including Double Up and Double Down wagers push.

The following additional rules also apply:

- 11. The dealer will hit on soft 17 and stand on all other 17's.
- 12. Player can split pairs other than Aces, 3 times for 4 hands.
- 13. Double down on any 2-card hand.
- 14. Double down after splits.
- 15. Cannot hit or double down after split aces.
- 16. Cannot re-split aces.
- 17. Surrender is not allowed.
- 18. Insurance if taken when the dealer shows an Ace pays 2:1.

The 16 Bonus side wager is an optional wager based on the outcome of the dealer's hand. The 16 Bonus side wager wins, if the dealer's hand reaches a total of 16. The number of cards in the dealer's hand determines the payout according to the pay tables below:
