FIVE CARD LINKED PROGRESSIVE

Game Description

The Five Card Linked Progressive is an optional progressive side bet for the following games played using a standard 52-card deck of cards. To begin, players must make the required base game wager to place the Five Card Linked Progressive side bet on the following games.

- All In Stud
- Cajun Stud
- Four Card Frenzy
- Four Card Prime
- Three Card Prime
- World Poker Tour (WPT) Heads up Hold'em

Players are paid against a paytable if they are able to create a qualifying hand that uses the player's cards combined with the Five Card Linked Progressive community cards as follows:

- All In Stud: The *Five Card Linked Progressive* hand is formed by combining the player's three card hand with the two *Five Card Linked Progressive* community cards.
- Cajun Stud: The Five Card Linked Progressive hand is formed by combining the player's two card hand with the three Five Card Linked Progressive community cards.
- Four Card Frenzy: The Five Card Linked Progressive uses the player's five card hand.
- Four Card Prime: The Five Card Linked Progressive uses the player's five card hand.
- Three Card Prime: The Five Card Linked Progressive hand is formed by combining the player's three card hand with the with the two Five Card Linked Progressive community cards.
- World Poker Tour (WPT) Heads up Hold'em: The Five Card Linked Progressive hand is formed by combining the player's two card hand with the three face down Five Card Linked Progressive community cards.
