## **LUCKY 9**

## Rules of Play

- 1. To begin each round, players are required to place a primary game wager. Optionally, players may also place a *Bonus 9, Tie, 21+3 Progressive*, and/or *Suited or Booted* wager.
- 2. Players are dealt two cards face up, while the dealer is dealt one card face up and one card face down.
- 3. The dealer reconciles the *Bonus 9* and the *21+3 Progressive* wagers according to their posted paytables.
- 4. The player now acts on their hand by choosing to either:
  - a. **Stand** Receive no further cards
  - b. **Hit** Receive a third card (players may only hit once)
  - c. Split any two cards of the same point value.
    - i. A player must make an additional wager equal to the primary wager.
    - ii. The cards are divided into two, one-card hands. One new card will be dealt to each hand. Players cannot hit a split hand, however, may split up to three times for a total of four hands.
- 5. After all players have acted, the dealer reveals their hole-card and either:
  - a. Draws a third card if their two-card total is 4 or lower.
  - b. Stands with a two-card total of 5 or more.
- 6. The dealer compares his hand to the player's hand and reconciles the primary and *Tie* wagers as follows:
  - a. If the player's hand totals 0, 1, or 2 points, the player does not qualify, and the primary wager automatically loses.
  - b. If the player's hand has a greater point value than the dealer, the player's primary wager pays 1 to 1.
  - c. If both the player and dealer have equally valued hands, the primary wager is pushed and the *Tie* wager pays according to the posted paytable.
    - i. If both the player and the dealer have hands totaling 9 points, the hands are reconciled depending on the configured version.



## **Rules of Play**

- 1. To begin each round, players are required to place a standard base game wager. Optionally, players may also place a 21+3 Progressive wager.
- 2. The dealer follows house procedures to deal the primary base game.
- 3. The dealer then follows house procedures to reconcile the 21+3 Progressive wagers. Winning 21+3 Progressive wagers are paid according to the corresponding paytable.

The primary game can now be played to completion and/or all other pending wagers can be reconciled.



## **Rules of Play**

- 1. To begin each round, players are required to place a standard Blackjack wager. Optionally, players may also place a *Suited or Booted* progressive wager.
- 2. The dealer follows house procedures to deal the primary Blackjack game.
- 3. The dealer then follows house procedures to reconcile primary wagers. **Note**: If a *Suited or Booted* progressive wager was placed:
  - a. The player's first two cards (and first hit card, if the Suited Wheel award(s) can be achieved) must not be discarded in the event of a busted hand, blackjack, or any other instance where a discard would be typical.
- 4. The dealer then follows house procedures to reconcile Suited or Booted progressive wagers and pays according to the corresponding paytable.
