Rules of Play

New Pan N9NE is a table game similar to Baccarat, featuring head-to-head play against the dealer and offers the optional Tie wager. In this version of the game 4, 6 or 8 standard 52 decks are utilized.

To begin play, the Player makes an initial Ante wager. They may also place the optional Tie wager. Once all wagers have been placed the dealer will deal each player and themselves two cards (they may be dealt face up or down to the player at the casino's discretion). The Dealer will deal two cards face down to themselves.

Note: It's at the operator's discretion whether or not to allow a player to play multiple hands.

The player may now decide to draw a single card or play their 2-card hand as is. Scoring is the same as in standard baccarat: Aces count as one, 2-9 count as their face value and 10-value cards count as zero. In the event the total exceeds 10 points, you eliminate the 10-column. For example, if the player has 10-4-8, it counts as two points.

Once each player has acted, the dealer will reveal their cards. If the dealer's two-card hand is a total of 0 through 5, they must draw a third card. Dealer must stay on a total of 6 or higher.

If a player beats the dealer's point total the ante is paid 1 to 1. If the player's point total is less than the dealer's point total the ante will lose. If the player and the dealer tie the ante pushes.

**If the player's hand outranks the dealer's hand with a three card 6, the ante wager pushes. **

Optional wager

Tie: This bet wins if the player and dealer have the same number of points.

Ante

Pays even money if player out scores dealer.

Pushes when the player beats the dealer with a score of Three card 6
