Wild Six Card Draw Poker-V2

Rules of Play

Wild Six Card Draw Poker is a house banked poker game played using one standard 52 card deck and two Jokers, which are wild.

To begin, players will place the primary poker bet to compete against the dealer. They may also make any of the available optional side wagers to include the addition of Jacks or Better. Each player then receives five cards face down and the dealer receives six cards face down.

If the player is dealt a straight or better on his original five cards, the player is an automatic winner and paid even money. If the player does not have a straight or better, the player may discard one card and draw a new card.

The dealer then reveals his hand. The dealer will select five of the six cards to make his best 5-card poker hand.

If the player has a better ranking hand, the dealer will pay the winning hand odds according to the paytables below.

If the player has a lower ranking hand, the dealer will take the losing wager. Tie hands push.

The <u>Jacks or Better</u> side wager pays odds if the player is dealt a pair of jacks or better on their original five card dealt. Otherwise, the side wager is lost.
