The above-captioned matter came before the Nevada Gaming Commission (Commission) on February 22, 2018, for an evidentiary hearing pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 463.337 and 463.310(3). Respondent, JESUS SAUCEDO, being duly noticed of the hearing, appeared on his own behalf. The NEVADA GAMING CONTROL BOARD (BOARD) appeared by and through its counsel, Michael P. Somps, Senior Deputy Attorney General.

Having carefully reviewed and considered the evidence, including the arguments of the parties, the Commission by affirmative unanimous vote of the four (4) Commission members present found that the BOARD met its burden of proving the allegations set forth in the Complaint by a preponderance of evidence pursuant to Regulation 7.230(1). Therefore, the Commission, believing it to be fully advised on the facts and issues before it, makes the following findings pursuant to NRS 463.310(6) and 463.3145:

### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. That the Commission has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to NRS 463.310(3) and 463.337.
- 2. That Respondent, JESUS SAUCEDO, is registered with the BOARD as a gaming employee and, as such, is subject to the provisions of the Nevada

- Gaming Control Act and the Regulations of the Commission.
- 3. That on or about June 17, 2017, Respondent was a registered gaming employee employed by and working as a poker dealer at Parball Newco, LLC, dba Bally's Las Vegas (Bally's).
- 4. That Bally's is a Nevada licensed gaming establishment holding a nonrestricted gaming license.
- 5. That on or about June 17, 2017, Respondent was observed by a Bally's Surveillance Agent taking a \$5.00 chip from the casino rake and placing the \$5.00 chip in Respondent's toke box.
- 6. That the \$5.00 chip that Respondent took from the casino rake was the property of Bally's.
- 7. That on or about June 17, 2017, Bally's Director of Security signed an Arrest by Private Person form and a Misdemeanor Citation/Complaint was signed by Respondent.
- 8. That further review of video surveillance by Bally's revealed two (2) additional occasions on June 17, 2017, where Respondent took a \$5.00 chip from the rake belonging to Bally's and Respondent placed the \$5.00 chip in Respondent's toke box.
- 9. That Respondent's actions on June 17, 2017, in taking the three (3) \$5.00 chips from the casino rake and placing them in Respondent's toke box were intentional.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 10. That pursuant to NRS 463.337(2):
  - 2. The Commission may revoke the registration of a gaming employee if the Commission finds, after a hearing as provided in NRS 463.310 and 463.312 to 463.3145, inclusive, that the gaming employee . . . , subsequent to being registered as a gaming employee:
