COMPLAINT FOR REVOCATION OF REGISTRATION AS GAMING EMPLOYEE

Complainant, NEVADA GAMING CONTROL BOARD (BOARD), by and through its counsel, ADAM PAUL LAXALT, Attorney General, and MICHAEL P. SOMPS, Senior Deputy Attorney General, hereby files this Complaint for Revocation of Registration as Gaming Employee against Respondent, GREGORY WALTER NORRIS, pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 463.310 and 463.337 and alleges as follows:

## **JURISDICTION**

- 1. Complainant, BOARD, is an administrative agency of the State of Nevada duly organized and existing under and by virtue of Chapter 463 of NRS and is charged with the administration and enforcement of the Nevada Gaming Control Act and the Regulations of the Nevada Gaming Commission.
- 2. Respondent, GREGORY WALTER NORRIS, at all times relevant hereto was and is registered with the BOARD as a gaming employee and, as such, is subject to the provisions of the Nevada Gaming Control Act and the Regulations of the Nevada Gaming Commission.

## FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

3. Nevada Property 1, LLC, dba The Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas (Cosmopolitan), at all times relevant hereto, was and is a Nevada licensed gaming establishment holding a nonrestricted gaming license.

- 4. From approximately May 2013 to February 2017, Respondent was employed by the Cosmopolitan working as a Pit Supervisor.
- 5. On or about December 16, 2016, the Cosmopolitan commenced an investigation of Respondent due to the suspicious actions of Respondent and Jacqueline Iannotti. Jacqueline Iannotti was subsequently identified as Jacqueline Norris who is the wife of Respondent.
- 6. The Cosmopolitan's investigation revealed that Respondent, over the course of approximately three (3) years, created fraudulent ratings for his wife in the Cosmopolitan's player tracking system using another pit supervisor's logon. In fact, Respondent's wife never actually played during the time that Respondent entered ratings for her.
- 7. Generally, a rating is created by a supervisor who inputs data into the player tracking system regarding a patron's gaming activity that includes items such as the patron's buy in, the patron's average bet, and the patron's losses.
- 8. Ratings result in the accumulation of points for a patron. Points can then be redeemed by a patron in the Cosmopolitan for "comps" such as hotel room nights, food and beverages, free promotional gaming chips, transportation, and entertainment.
- 9. As a result of Respondent's fraudulent activity, Respondent's wife accumulated approximately \$50,000 worth of illegitimate points.
- 10. Respondent's wife redeemed points for "comps" valued at approximately \$17,000 for items such as food and beverages, hotel room nights, and free promotional gaming chips.
- 11. On or about January 19, 2017, BOARD agents responded to the Cosmopolitan and were informed of the findings of the Cosmopolitan's internal investigation of Respondent.
- 12. On or about May 22, 2017, criminal charges were brought against Respondent and, on or about April 10, 2018, Respondent pled guilty to Conspiracy to Commit a Crime Theft (a Gross Misdemeanor).
- 13. Respondent is currently employed by the Tropicana Las Vegas working as a Table Games Supervisor.

## **VIOLATION**

- 14. An individual's registration as a gaming employee may be revoked by the Nevada Gaming Commission if that individual has committed, attempted, or conspired to commit larceny or embezzlement against a gaming licensee or upon the premises of a licensed gaming establishment, or if that individual has been convicted of any gross misdemeanor. Specifically, NRS 463.337(2) provides in relevant part the following:
  - 2. The Commission may revoke the registration of a gaming employee if the Commission finds, after a hearing as provided in NRS 463.310 and 463.312 to 463.3145, inclusive, that the gaming employee . . . , subsequent to being registered as a gaming employee:

(d) Committed, attempted or conspired to commit larceny or embezzlement against a gaming licensee or upon the

premises of a licensed gaming establishment;

- (j) Been convicted of any felony or gross misdemeanor, other than one constituting a violation of this chapter or chapter 463B, 464 or 465 of NRS.
- 15. NRS 205.0833(1) provides in relevant part that "[c]onduct denominated theft in NRS 205.0821 to 205.0835, inclusive, constitutes a single offense embracing the separate offenses commonly known as larceny . . . embezzlement . . . and other similar offenses.
- 16. Respondent, a registered gaming employee, committed, attempted or conspired to commit larceny or embezzlement against the Cosmopolitan or upon the premises of the Cosmopolitan, and/or was convicted of a gross misdemeanor.

WHEREFORE, based upon the allegations contained herein, which constitute grounds for the revocation of Respondent's registration as a gaming employee pursuant to NRS 463.337, the BOARD prays for relief as follows:

1. That the Nevada Gaming Commission serve a copy of this Complaint on Respondent pursuant to NRS 463.312(2); and
