FINAL ORDER OF EXCLUSION

On November 5, 2022, the Nevada Gaming Control Board (Board) entered its Order nominating LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON as a candidate to the List of Excluded Persons pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 463.151 through 463.155 and Nevada Gaming Commission Regulation 28. After being personally served the Notice of Candidacy and Order of Nomination to List of Excluded Persons on October 12, 2022, LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON requested a hearing before the Nevada Gaming Commission (Commission) pursuant to NRS 463.153(1). The Board filed a Bill of Particulars on November 2, 2022. This matter came before the Commission on November 17, 2022. JOHN S. MICHELA, Senior Deputy Attorney General, appeared on behalf of the Board. LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON appeared in pro per.

Having reviewed and carefully considered the record together with all of the evidence presented, the Commission, believing it to be fully advised on the facts and issues before it, makes the following findings:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Pursuant to NRS 463.151(3)(a), LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON has been convicted of crimes that are felonies in this state. Specifically:

- a) On or about April 12, 2015, LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON was convicted in Nevada of Theft in violation of NRS 193.330, 205.0832, and 205.0835, a Category D Felony. The facts giving rise to this conviction occurred in a licensed gaming establishment.
- b) On or about January 18, 2005, LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON was convicted in Nevada of Attempted Theft in violation of NRS 193.330, 205.220, and 205.222, a Category D Felony. The facts giving rise to this conviction occurred in a licensed gaming establishment.
- c) On or about September 27, 2002, LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON was convicted in Nevada of Grand Larceny in violation of NRS 205.220, and 205.222, a Felony. The facts giving rise to this conviction occurred in a licensed gaming establishment.
- 2. Pursuant to NRS 463.151(3)(a), LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON has been convicted of crimes involving moral turpitude. Specifically:
- a) On or about April 12, 2015, LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON was convicted in Nevada of Theft in violation of NRS 193.330, 205.0832, and 205.0835, a Category D Felony. The facts giving rise to this conviction occurred in a licensed gaming establishment.
- b) On or about January 18, 2005, LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON was convicted in Nevada of Attempted Theft in violation of NRS 193.330, 205.220, and 205.222, a Category D Felony. The facts giving rise to this conviction occurred in a licensed gaming establishment.
- c) On or about September 27, 2002, LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON was convicted in Nevada of Grand Larceny in violation of NRS 205.220, and 205.222, a Felony. The facts giving rise to this conviction occurred in a licensed gaming establishment.
- d) On or about February 14, 2020, LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON pled guilty to Conspiracy to Commit a Crime in violation of NRS 199.480. The facts giving rise to this conviction were based on attempting to manufacture a cheating device in the form of counterfeit gaming chips.

- e) On or about June 27, 2008, LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON was convicted in Nevada of Conspiracy to Commit Theft in violation of NRS 199.480, 205.0832, and 205.0835, a Gross Misdemeanor. The facts giving rise to this conviction occurred in a licensed gaming establishment.
- 3. Pursuant to NRS 463:151(3)(d), LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON has been excluded from an establishment which conducts gaming by the written order of a governmental agency. Specifically:
- a) On or about August 12, 2015, Eighth Judicial District Court of Nevada, Judge Carolyn Ellsworth, ordered as a probation condition for LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON "[d]o not enter any gaming establishment, including bars, unless employed." Judge Ellsworth reaffirmed this exclusion in the Amended Judgment of Conviction: "Defendant may not enter any gaming establishment unless employed."
- b) On or about September 27, 2002, a Judge in the Eighth Judicial District Court of Nevada ordered as a probation condition for LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON, "Defendant not to gamble or enter into a gaming establishment during the term of probation."
- 4. LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON continues to have contacts with the State of Nevada and poses a threat to the interests of the State of Nevada and to licensed gaming as demonstrated by the fact LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON has been arrested by Board agents approximately 34 times from 1990 through 2021 based on theft of casino gaming chips from licensees or patrons of gaming licensees or counterfeit casino gaming chip production.
- 5. The race, color, creed, national origin or ancestry, sex, sexual orientation, or gender identity or expression of LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON is not and has not been considered for placing his name on the List of Excluded Persons.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

6. The Commission has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to NRS 463.153(1).

- 7. The procedural requirements of the Nevada Gaming Control Act and Nev. Gaming Comm'n Reg. 28 have been satisfied.
- 8. The sole issue before the Commission is whether at least one of the criteria set forth in NRS 463.151(3) to place LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON on the List of Excluded Persons has been met.
- 9. The Nevada Legislature has provided that the Board may nominate, and the Commission may so include a person on the List of Excluded Persons by reason of the fact that such person has a "[p]rior conviction of a crime which is a felony in this state or under the laws of the United States, a crime involving moral turpitude or a violation of the gaming laws of any state." NRS 463.151(3)(a).
- 10. The Nevada Legislature has provided that the Board may nominate, and the Commission may so include a person on the List of Excluded Persons by reason of the fact that such person has been the subject of a "[w]ritten order of a governmental agency which authorizes the exclusion or ejection of the person from an establishment at which gaming or pari-mutuel wagering is conducted." NRS 463.151(3)(d).
- 11. The Commission has also determined that a finding of any one of the criteria set forth in NRS 463.151(3) is sufficient to place the name of an individual on the List of Excluded Persons. See Nev. Gaming Comm'n Reg. 28.010(2).
- 12. Given the preceding findings of fact, the criteria of NRS 463.151(3)(a), that LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON has been convicted of a crime which is a felony under the laws of this state, is met. The criteria of NRS 463.151(3)(a), that LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON has been convicted of crimes involving moral turpitude, is met. The criteria of NRS 463.151(3)(d), that LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON has been the subject of a written order of a governmental agency excluding him from an establishment at which gaming is conducted, is met. Each of these, standing on its own, is sufficient to place LEONARD MORGAN HAIRSTON on the list of persons to be excluded or ejected from any licensed gaming establishment in the State of Nevada which conducts pari-mutuel wagering or operates any race book, sports pool, or games, other than slot machines only.

1 13. Should any of the foregoing Conclusions of Law be deemed Findings of Fact, they 2 shall be so construed. 3 Accordingly, the Commission finds and concludes that LEONARD MORGAN 4 HAIRSTON is a person whose presence in licensed gaming establishments would pose a 5 threat to the interests of this state or to licensed gaming, or both.
